Many years ago, England observed a day honor mothers that was called to Mothering Sunday. In the United Kingdom, Mothers' Day is celebrated in March.

The first known suggestion of Mother's Day in the United States was in 1872 by Julia Ward Howe. She suggested that people observe the day as a day dedicated to peace. Others around the country joined her in campaigning for a nationwide observance of Mother's Day. It became a tradition to celebrate mothers the second Sunday in May. The custom is to wear a colored carnation if one's mother is still living, a white one if one's mother has passed away.

In 1914, **President Woodrow Wilson** signed a joint resolution of Congress recommending that Congress and the executive branch of government recognize the observance of Mother's Day.

Mother's Day, this year, is Sunday, May 13th.

On Memorial Day - May 28, 2012



Memorial Day (originally called "Decoration Day") began as a way to honor the Civil War dead. It started when individuals, and then cities and town, placed flowers on the graves of Confederate and Union soldiers – whether buried in the North or the South. The first

national observance of Memorial Day occurred on May 30, 1868, in Arlington National Cemetery. Today, Memorial Day has become a way to honor all those who died in service to the nation in all wars and conflicts, from the Revolutionary War to the present. In 1968, the official holiday was moved to the last Monday in May.

The following article was written by Florence Coleman, recalling all the greatness and values that Grace (Vitale) Randazzo brought and contributed to the Italian Club.

Grace joined our Club in 1972, forty years ago. She was a very devoted member who was never hesitant about expressing her opinion. She was Secretary when the minutes were written on sheets of paper and later in a book, right from the meetings.

She was Scheduling Chairperson during all of our festivals at Yack Arena. She knew just where everyone was to work. You HAD to check in with her committee before you started.

She had great ideas for 4th of July Parades. We won 1st place for the Statue of Liberty. She had our young teenagers involved in some of them. She thought of a Spaghetti/Meatballs float, that also won. She won out with bells and whistles on her last idea in 1992, the Nina. Built over **Dick Coleman's** new 1992 Ranger. She called me from Florida and sent a picture. I told her I think we could do it. I was in charge of the boat. She took care of the mast and sail. We spent many days on my driveway

with that boat. What fun we had. We won a first Place Trophy.

It was her idea to have Italian Classes at the Club. When the class was over, they performed a skit, on the stage, in Italian, to show us what they had learned.

She was instrumental in organizing our present Nomination Committee and chairing it according to Roberts Rules of Order. If she had a job to do, she did it with every ounce of her energy. She was a leader and we followed.

In our early years, we held afternoon Ladies Luncheons along with White Elephant sales for members and friends. Grace would write little skits and have the women dress up in whatever she needed. They performed their part as written. She had a way of making you do things you didn't think you could do.... But you did it, because Grace wanted you to....

She loved going to the casino. She kept us laughing with her Italian jokes on our Bianco bus trips. She printed up song sheets, passed them out and we all sang our hearts out.

She was also very active at Bishop Towers doing the same things.

She had been to our last few Legend's Shows and enjoyed every one of them. At our last Christmas Party she was out there dancing with her cousins laughing and enjoying every minute. She surprised us all. She reminds me of the song, *"I Hope you dance"* by Lee Ann Womack

Grace had her struggles, but she always overcame them. She put her pain on the back burners and always went forward. In my heart, I feel she knew her time was coming. Grace, we all know you are up there, now running things and most of all, singing and dancing.

Grace was the lead person of the Club Member's Notification List program.

God Bless you for all the hearts you have touched.

Italian Celebrations, Holidays and Events in May



May, *maggio*, in Italy is a good time to find spring festivals. We find flower festivals, food and wine festivals, medieval reenactments, and events celebrating rituals of spring. We may be familiar with some of these from our

parent's home cities, villages, or regions in Italy. Here are just a few:

May Day, May 1, is a **public holiday** all over Italy as the day of the worker. We will find interesting parades and festivals to celebrate the day. Expect big crowds in popular Italian tourist destinations.

The Risotto Festival the first Sunday in May in the Piedmont town of *Sesame* is a huge feast of a special rice dish dating back to the 13th century.

Giro d'Italia, Italy's big bike race similar to the Tour d'France, starts in early May and lasts most of the month. Bikers race through scenic countryside.

Polenta Festival, the second Sunday in May, is celebrated in the main square of the Piedmont town of *Avigliana*.

La Barabbata is celebrated May 14 in *Marta* on the shores of Lake Bolsena. Men wear costumes in procession representing the old trades and carry their tools while white buffalo pull floats carrying the fruits of the trades.

The Flower Festival of *Bucchianico* in province of Abruzzi includes a re-enactment of a 13th-century military stratagem with a parade, the third Sunday in May.

Pinocchio's Birthday is celebrated May 25 in the Tuscan town of *Pescia*.

The Chianti Wine Festival, the last Sunday in May and first Sunday in June, takes place in *Montespertoli* in the Chianti wine region of Tuscany.

The Daffodil Festival in the Abruzzi town of *Rocca di Mezzo* celebrates spring with folk dancing and a parade the last Sunday in May.
